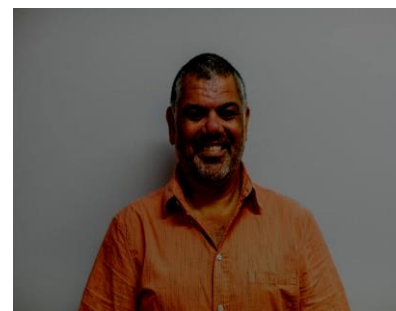

Kenya, Tanzania, Namibia South Africa, Nigeria, Reunion Island and Liberia. We have a presence in the ports of Mombasa, Richards Bay, Durban, Port Elizabeth/Koega, Saldanha Bay, Cape Town, Walvis Bay, Lagos, and Monrovia.

The work in these ports is carried out by Port Chaplains and Ship Visitors with the support and assistance of Management Committees. At present we support the work in two ecumenical centers namely Richards Bay and Durban and Reunion Island. There is a MTS center in Lagos and Mombasa.
