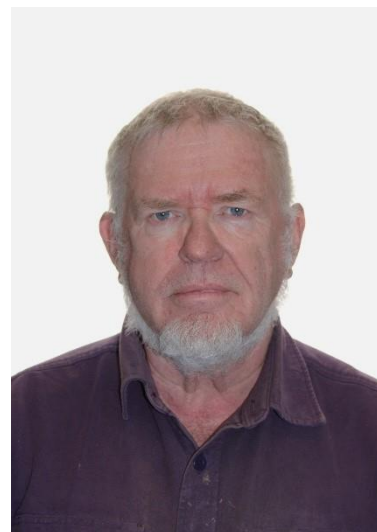

This month we are praying for the work in the Canada Region.

The Regional Director for Canada is Eric Phinney. He became an MtS chaplain in 2015 and has been regional director since spring 2025. Please pray for Eric and his team. MtS Canada is now truly represented from the East coast to the West Coast, with our newest station coming online this month in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador, the furthest eastern port in the country.

Our Canadian maritime stations in Halifax, Nova Scotia and Saint John, New Brunswick continue to welcome thousands of cargo and cruise ship Seafarers throughout the year. Our Great Lakes stations serve the middle of the country on the largest fresh water lakes in the world in Oshawa, Toronto, Hamilton, Port Colborne, Windsor, Sarnia, and Thunder Bay. These ports are open from March through December as the lakes freeze in the winter. Vancouver, one of our oldest and largest centres, continues to serve the ever expanding ports of Vancouver in the Fraser River Valley, as well as the terminals in Roberts Bank, on the far west coast of the country.
