We give thanks for Raeid, that he was able to 'navigate' his way inside the port with the help of the port officials and give aid to the seafarers in word and action.

Mon 2nd

Looking ahead we pray for our continuing work within the **Diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East**.

Tue 3rd

We also pray for a way forward so that we can be present in the **Kingdom of Saudi Arabia** and provide welfare services in their ports.

Wed 4th

Bahrain - Prayers for Fr. Issac Franklin (known to us all as Franklin) We continue to pray and give thanks for the work of the Mission in the Kingdom of Bahrain. The relationship we have with St. Christopher's Cathedral and their council.

Thu 5th

Prayers for a new Dean which hopefully will come in the middle of this year 2026. Fr. Franklin leads the Tamil speaking church as well as being the Mission Chaplain. The Seafarers Centre is run by the Bahrain International Seafarers Society (BISS) and is in Khalifa Bin Salman Port.
