**Meeting Place**

Outside the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust Discovery Centre near Kilnsea,  
Spurn Road, HU12 0UH

You can park on the other side of the road in Centre Car Park. The £5 parking fee goes towards the management and care of the Spurn.

*The 72 EYMS service bus from Hull interchange arrives at the Centre at 10am. If you intend to come by bus, please let me know so that I can advise whether there are likely to be seats available.*

1pm Prayers and Reflection, including anointing for healing,  
led by Bishop Eleanor,

2pm Walk 3½ miles back

4pm Arrive at Discovery Centre
